Chettinad

Deep in the south of Tamil Nadu, in what is essentially a rural area in the middle of nowhere, were the 96 villages the Chettiars founded, and which earned them their preferred community name - Nagarathar - the townsfolk, or the sophisticated.

With an inborn talent for trade strengthened by a rare financial acumen, the Nagarathars dominated the business world since the early centuries of the second millennium.

In their heydays, a glorious hundred-year period, they built for their homes, fortress-like mansions and filled them with riches they earned from across the seas. They held lifestyle rituals in the grandest possible manner whose conduct helped maintain a community's unbroken tradition, contributed to create their greatest strength, their unity, established their reputation for rare hospitality and paved the way for the creation of an exceptional cuisine.

Apart from using their wealth to make families more comfortable, they invested it for the greater good of the community; they restored every major temple; they built universities; the world of letters and fine arts also equally benefitted from the gracious Nagarathar generosity.

This festival is a reminder of those glorious hundred years.




Dr. Madhusudhanan Kalaichelvan

Mrs Meenakshi Meyyappan moved to Chettinad, her ancestral home, from Chennai, a little after her husband passed away in 1997, she has committed herself to everything Chettinad. The entire gamut of Chettinad cuisine, rituals/celebrations, family relationships, the architecture/interiors, temples, sarees/textiles, jewellery, and anything that is Chettinad. Chettinad simply grew on her.

Aachi, as she's fondly addressed, focused on the restoration of Senjai Bangala, a family property then in poor condition, and transformed it into 'The Bangala' in 1999, as the first Heritage Hotel in Chettinad. 'The Bangala' has played a significant role in making Chettinad a heritage and cultural destination ever since, and found itself a place on the important Chennai/Kochi Circuit.

Her remarkable skills in maintaining a pristine home, her great interest in food and table settings, impeccable talent with interiors, love for gardening and a fondness for books, has made 'The Bangala' blossom into a fine Heritage Hotel, which to many is more like a home. And, her attention to detail is legendary. Her insistence on the traditional banana leaf lunch in 'The Bangala' is one such detail.

Passion always rewards. The Bangala was ranked by Condé Nast Traveller as one of the Best Restaurants in India, it was placed 27th in 2018, and ascended to 7th place in 2019. To be hidden in deep south of India and still be recognised by a world-wide magazine is something remarkable. And not to stop with putting 'The Bangala' on the map, she has been instrumental in bringing out three well acclaimed coffee table books on Chettinad: The Chettiar Heritage, The Mansions of Chettinad and The Bangala Table.

Currently her efforts are focused on trying to showcase, highlight and create awareness of the rich culture of Chettinad to the outside world. Hence she has created 'The Chettinad Heritage and Cultural Trust', which is now running the second edition of The Chettinad Heritage and Cultural Festival, an effort to generate the attention Chettinad truly deserves.


Referred to as “Thiru-Perum-Thurai” in the sacred Thiruvachakam hymns of Maanikkavaasagar, this ancient settlement near Pudukkottai is considered to be the venue of initiation of this 9th century CE saint poet. The grand temple complex with massive sculptural depictions of various deities and mural paintings takes us to the 16th century, Tamil Nadu.


